Lancaster Thrives Together, a new grant program for 2025, is a \$375,000 (\$10,000 -\$50,000 per grant) competitive opportunity for community benefit organizations (CBOs) serving Lancaster County residents.

These organizations will provide innovative services helping individuals and families achieve economic stability.

Lancaster Thrives Together grants will support upstream solutions designed to address the root causes of poverty and the diverse needs of both unemployed and ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) populations, to help level the economic playing field among our neighbors, while promoting long-term self-sufficiency. Preference will be given to projects that promote economic stability in underserved communities, recognizing the disproportionate challenges these communities face. Knowing it will take a holistic approach to ensure our most vulnerable

striving neighbors have the opportunity to thrive, we will accept applications for initiatives demonstrating leadership, systems change, and innovation across a range of service areas, including:

- Financial literacy
- Adult education, skills development, and job training and placement
- Housing assistance and homelessness prevention
- Access to healthcare, including mental health and substance abuse services
- Childcare and early education
- Legal services
- Supportive services for incarcerated/ formerly incarcerated individuals
- Supportive services for refugees and immigrants

HOW DOES AN ORGANIZATIONAL ENDOWMENT WORK?

Endowments are a tool to provide consistent, long-term funding for your organization. Assets (cash, stocks, real estate, and more) that are donated to your organization through the Community Foundation are pooled and invested. Once a year, 4% of the total is available to spend or be reinvested. The spendable amount is unrestricted—it can be spent in whatever way serves your organization best.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

When you're connected with us through an endowment, you're in good company with more than 70 other community benefit organizations in the county.

Having an organizational endowment with the Community Foundation is a way to outsource endowment as a part of your overarching fundraising strategy. We take care of donor acknowledgements, oversight of investments through PNC, a dedicated webpage for online giving, fundholder events, and further learning opportunities.

All organizations with an endowment of \$50,000 or more are also able to open a Flex Fund, which allows access to the full amount in that fund at any time for discretionary use.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Any 501(c)(3) organization is eligible to open an endowment at the Lancaster County Community Foundation. However, this won't be the best fit for every organization. Things to consider include financial stability, an established donor base, a mission that you want to extend into the future, and board commitment. We do not have a minimum contribution to establish a fund, and distributions will be made once the fund reaches \$10,000.

WHAT ARE OTHER OPTIONS BESIDES ENDOWMENT FOR CBOS?

If endowment isn't the right fit for you right now, there are a range of other options available. Board members and individual donors can open funds at the Community Foundation to benefit your organization, with ease of administration by our team.



DONOR ADVISED FUNDS

A donor advised fund is one of the most flexible giving options available at the Community
Foundation. When a donor or board member opens a donor advised fund, they can use it to send money to your organization and others throughout the year.

CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITY

This planned giving vehicle that allows the donor to receive a fixed income stream for life while making a significant contribution to an organization of their choice. At the Community Foundation, charitable gift annuities convert to an endowed fund for your organization after the donor passes away.

LEGACY GIVING

Leaving a legacy gift means making a plan today to leave money to an organization or cause a donor cares about in the future. This plan can be simple and changed at any time.

Planned gifts are an opportunity for people from all income levels to leave a lasting impact on their community without changing their current lifestyle. There is no minimum amount to include an organization in your will and no out-of-pocket cost.
